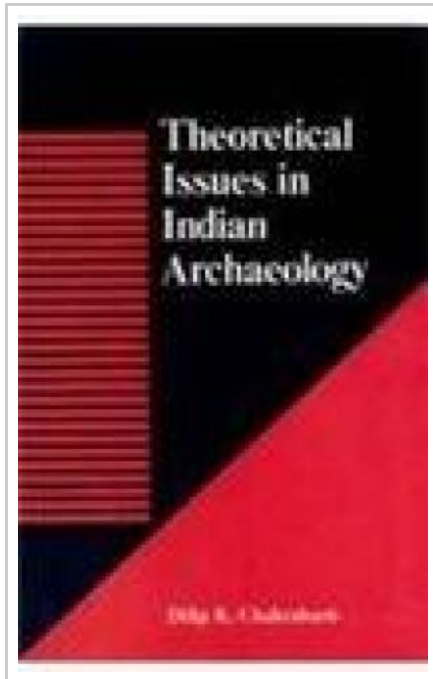




Theoretical Issues In Indian Archaeology
